The anesthesiologist will meet you and your child on the day of anesthesia. If your child has a lot of medical problems, you may be asked to come in to meet an anesthesiologist before the day of the procedure. If your child is already in the hospital, a member of the anesthesia team will see your child ahead of time.

Young children have disproportionately large body surface areas, and heat loss is exaggerated during anesthesia, especially during the induction of anesthesia, unless this is actively prevented. 4 Hypothermia, particularly in neonates, delays the metabolism and excretion of anesthetic agents and can also potentiate neuromuscular blockade. 5

In general, anesthesia is deemed safe for individuals with WS. However, there are reported cases of sudden death. Doctors are encouraged to conduct a careful review of all the literature prior to any procedure requiring anesthesia for a child with Williams syndrome.

### Anesthesia May Harm Children’s Brains

Anaesthetists are frequently required to deal with a child who is uncooperative at induction of anaesthesia. In studies undertaken in the 1990s, one-third of children were found to be distressed at induction while one-quarter required physical restraint. 1, 2 Dealing with an uncooperative child can be distressing for the patient, parents, and health-care workers.

### Anaesthesia for the uncooperative child | BJA Education ...

Children with neuromuscular disease commonly present requiring anaesthesia for diagnostic and surgical procedures. The specific diagnosis is very important to inform a logical plan for the anaesthetic technique, ensuring awareness of possible triggers for serious adverse events. Succinylcholine and volatile anaesthesia should be avoided.

### Anaesthesia for children with neuromuscular disease | BJA ...

Anesthesia may be given to your child with a plastic mask, or through an IV, or both. Anesthesia from a mask is gentle and painless, and does not involve getting a “shot”. Anesthesia from a mask is the most common way of “going to sleep” in children having routine surgery and procedures. After falling asleep, an IV is started.

Regional anesthesia. An anesthetic drug is injected near a cluster of nerves, numbing a larger area of the body (such as below the waist). Most children who receive regional anesthesia are deeply sedated or asleep for the procedure.

For kids with special needs, such as ADHD or autism, general anaesthesia or sedation can also make a procedure that would be very frightening more manageable, says Chadha. “You want to build on that positive experience, ensuring the child doesn’t associate the dentist with pain and anxiety,” she says.

### Should you let your child undergo anaesthesia for a dental ...

Anytime a child undergoes a surgical procedure requiring anesthesia or sedation, parents will have questions about possible risks—especially when that child is an infant or a toddler. In an effort to help families prepare, the American Academy of Pediatrics (AAP) answers frequently asked questions about the safety of anesthesia.

For instance, all of the children in the research that has been published to date were likely given halothane, a drug that is no longer used in the United States. There are also still questions about whether other factors increase the risk of learning disabilities for children who undergo surgery or are given general anesthesia.

### The Safety of Anesthesia for Toddlers
