For Carl Jung, his view on religious experience was based on all experiences being a psychological phenomenon. He differed from James in his view that a personal or individual experience with a God was indistinguishable from a communication with one's unconscious mind.

Jung's letter went on to say that, "...alcohol in Latin is spiritus " and that the same Latin word is used for "the highest religious experience as well as the most depraving poison.
