### Major, Minor, Diminished, and Augmented Chords

In a major key, such as in C major, if you build a triad on the seventh scale degree in a C major scale (a B note), you build a B diminished chord with the notes B-D-F. However, if you take a minor key, such as A harmonic minor, and build a triad on the third scale degree (a C note), you build a C augmented chord.

### Major, Minor, Diminished & Augmented Chords Explained ...

The logic is the same as we saw for the denominations "major" and "minor". The denomination "augmented" indicates a longer interval and "diminished" indicates a shorter interval. "Perfect" is in the middle between these two. But couldn't we just use the names "major" and "minor" for all the notes instead of using "diminished", "augmented" and "perfect"? Yes, we could. ### Augmented, Diminished and Perfect Intervals | Simplifying ...

A major third is equal to 4 half steps or 4 semitones ( 2 tones) A minor third is equal to 3 half steps or 3 semitones (1+1/2 tones) 1sts, 4ths, 5ths and 8ths can be made Perfect, Augmented and Diminished. 2nds, 3rds, 6ths and 7ths can be made Major, Minor, Augmented and Diminished.

### Constructing Major, Minor, Augmented and Diminished Triads ...

If an interval is a half-step larger than a perfect or a major interval, it is called augmented. An interval that is a half-step smaller than a perfect or a minor interval is called diminished. A double sharp or double flat is sometimes needed to write an augmented or diminished interval correctly.

Conversely, minor, major, augmented or diminished intervals are typically considered less consonant, and were traditionally classified as mediocre consonances, imperfect consonances, or dissonances. Within a diatonic scale all unisons (P1) and octaves (P8) are perfect.

Inverting augmented and diminished intervals Augmented and diminished intervals work in a similar way to major and minor intervals. When augmented intervals are inverted they become diminished and vice versa, diminished intervals when inverted become augmented. For example, a diminished 5th when inverted becomes an augmented 4th and vice versa.

An interval of the number one or first is called a unison and an interval of the eighth is called an octave. Five interval qualities are possible: perfect, major, minor, diminished, and augmented. The quality of an interval is determined by the number of half steps it contains.

Triad chords exist in four different chord qualities, which are major, minor, augmented, and diminished. Each chord quality name is the name of the entire chord as a whole, not its individual notes (which will be covered later). Triad chord qualities using the 1st, 3rd and 5th scale notes
