Making your birth plan. A birth plan is a record of what you would like to happen during your labour and after the birth. You don't have to create a birth plan but, if you would like one, your midwife will be able to help. Discussing a birth plan with your midwife gives you the chance to ask questions and find out more about what happens in labour.

This may be necessary if the perineum won't stretch enough and may tear, or if the baby is short of oxygen and needs to be delivered quickly.

Skin-to-skin contact with your baby. Immediately after the birth you can have your baby lifted straight onto you before the cord is cut so that you can be close to each other immediately. If you prefer, you can ask the midwife to wipe your baby and wrap him or her in a blanket first.

My birth plan - NHS

Tell your birthing partner about the plan. It's a good idea to talk about your plan with whoever will be with you at the birth. If they know what you expect to happen and what your decisions are, they'll be able to give you the right support. If you're going to be on your own during labour, your midwife will be there to help and support you.

Your birth plan is a written document to communicate to those involved in your birth, what you would like to happen during and immediately after the delivery. It can explain the type of labour you would like, anything you'd like to avoid and who you want there with you.

A birth plan is a document that lets your medical team know your preferences for things such as how to manage labor pain. Keep in mind that you can't control every aspect of labor and delivery, and you'll need to stay flexible in case something comes up that requires your birth team to depart from your plan.

A birth plan is about putting down your preferences, in black and white, before labor begins so that you are prepared for whatever events may arise and can make informed choices about your and baby's care and safety.

What is a birth plan? A birth plan is a way for you to communicate your wishes to the midwives and doctors who care for you in labour. It tells them about the type of labour and birth you'd like to have, what you want to happen, and what you hope to avoid (NHS 2018a). A birth plan isn't written in stone.

Your partner should be able to stay in the theatre for the whole time if you have a regional anaesthetic (OAA 2011). Your obstetrician will ask him to sit down and avoid certain areas of the theatre, to help maintain the sterile conditions in the room (OAA 2011). Hospital staff will provide your partner with thin cotton theatre clothing, as well as a mask, hat and special footwear.
